



Policy on passport photos for candidates of the New Zealand Registration Examination (NZREX Clinical)

Policy Statement

Candidates must submit four identical passport size photos (no older than 4 months) of which, one photo must be endorsed on the reverse as a true likeness of the candidate with his or her application for NZREX Clinical.

Rationale

Staff at the examination venue must be able to accurately identify candidates sitting NZREX Clinical to ensure that the correct candidate attempts the examination.

Background

Candidates of NZREX Clinical are required to submit four identical recent passport size photos, one of the photos must be endorsed on the reverse as a true likeness of the candidate with his or her application for NZREX Clinical.

Candidates must produce either their passport or New Zealand Drivers License on the day of the examination as evidence of their identity before they can be admitted to the examination.

One of the passport photos will be converted into an identification badge and will be issued to the candidate when registering on the day of the examination.

Procedures

If the photos do not match the appearance of the candidate as judged by Council staff on the day of the examination, the candidate will not be allowed to attempt the examination and no refund will be considered.
