## Te Whatu Ora – Waitaha Canterbury – Progress on required actions

Canterbury DHB underwent an accreditation assessment as a provider of prevocational medical training on 24 and 25 September 2019.

The overall outcome of the assessment for Canterbury DHB's accreditation was 'substantially met'.

On 1 July 2022, Te Whatu Ora | Health New Zealand replaced Aotearoa New Zealand's 20 DHBs. The prevocational training programme run by Canterbury DHB is now run by Te Whatu Ora – Waitaha Canterbury.

Te Whatu Ora – Waitaha Canterbury is currently accredited for prevocational medical training until 31 August 2025, subject to satisfactorily addressing the required actions listed below.
