

South Canterbury District Health Board – Progress on required actions

South Canterbury DHB underwent an accreditation assessment as a provider of prevocational medical training on 24 and 25 July 2018.

The overall outcome of the assessment for South Canterbury DHB's accreditation was '**substantially met**'.

South Canterbury DHB is currently accredited for prevocational medical training until 30 April 2023, subject to satisfactorily addressing the required actions listed below.
