

## Canterbury District Health Board – Progress on required actions

Canterbury DHB underwent an accreditation assessment as a provider of prevocational medical training on 24 and 25 September 2019.

The overall outcome of the assessment for Canterbury DHB's accreditation was '**substantially met**'.

Canterbury DHB is currently accredited for prevocational medical training until 31 March 2024, subject to satisfactorily addressing the required actions listed below.

	Required actions on accreditation	Status	Date of decision
1	Canterbury DHB must ensure that all clinical supervisors must undertake relevant training in supervision and assessment after commencing their supervisory role. This must be within 12 months as appointment as a clinical supervisor. (Standard 4.3.3)	Met	14 Oct 2020
2	Canterbury DHB must ensure adherence to Council's policy on obtaining informed consent. (Standard 3.1.10)	Met	14 Oct 2020
3	Canterbury DHB must ensure that over the course of the 2 intern years each intern spends at least one clinical attachment in a community setting. (Standard 3.1.6)	Met	14 Oct 2020
4	Canterbury DHB must ensure that supervision and education of interns in relief attachments is consistent with the delivery of high quality training and safe patient care. (Standard 6.2.1)	Met	14 Oct 2020
